TIB Policy Brief Calls for Transparent and Accountable Land Services

Transparency International Bangladesh (TIB) identified 271 issues across 46 Upazila Land Offices, including delays, staff shortages, corruption, and lack of facilities for women and marginalized groups. TIB's policy brief urges full digitalization, dedicated staff, grievance redress systems, and strict accountability measures to make land services efficient, citizen-friendly, and corruption-free.

TIB Reviews Political Party Guidelines to Promote Transparent Elections

TIB reviewed the draft Political Party and Candidate Conduct Rules, 2025, highlighting gaps in campaign conduct, finances, and social media use. TIB calls for clear rules on campaign materials, limits on government resources, mandatory disclosure of party and candidate finances, and regulation of online content to strengthen accountability, prevent corruption, and ensure free and fair elections.

TIB expressed concern over the BDT 111 crore July Uprising Memorial Museum project at Ganabhaban being awarded through direct procurement, bypassing open tender rules. TIB Raises Concern Over Information and Human Rights Commissions Vacancy

TIB has strongly condemned the prolonged vacancy of the Information Commission and the Human Rights Commission, describing it as a serious failure of state responsibility. TIB emphasized that keeping these key institutions leaderless undermines transparency, accountability, and citizen's access to information and justice, and urged the government to promptly reconstitute both commissions to fulfill their constitutional and human rights mandates.

DIU Students Master Data Tools to Fight Corruption in TIB Workshop

TIB engaged aspiring journalists at Daffodil International University (DIU) in hands-on sessions on data collection, analysis, and visualization, showing how raw information can reveal corruption and drive accountability. Students explored real investigative stories, practiced data-driven reporting, and learned to use tools like open data and the Right to Information Act to demand transparency and integrity in public institutions. The workshop took place at the DIU campus on 23 July 2025.

Driving Transparency and Accountability Through Workshops

Committee of Concerned Citizens (CCC) workshops in Natore, Rangpur, and Jhenaidah brought together government officials, civil society, and development partners to advance transparency, accountability, and citizen-oriented governance. Participants developed actionable plans to improve service delivery, ensure access to information, and build inclusive, corruption-free institutions, translating commitments into tangible progress toward sustainable development.



CCC Nilphamari Drives Citizen Accountability

CCC Nilphamari organized a public hearing in collaboration with the District Administration, local residents voiced complaints about service delivery at the Tupamari Union Parishad, Land Office, Health and Family Welfare Center, and local schools. Officials engaged directly with citizens, promising timely resolution, strengthening accountability, transparency, and citizen-focused governance.

Transforming Schools with Women-Friendly Facilities

Using findings from the PACTApp, CCC Rangamati engaged with the District Education Office to improve women-friendly facilities in secondary schools, including separate toilets, hygiene supplies, and supportive corners for female students. Community feedback and advocacy sessions guided actionable plans, while CCC leaders and YES members mobilized citizens to ensure transparency, accountability, and inclusive, quality education across the district.



YES and ACG Members Leverage PACTApp to Drive Community Accountability

YES and ACG members in Chattogram received hands-on training on PACTApp, learning to collect real-time data and tackle local governance challenges. The session empowered the participants to promote integrity, ensure transparency, and take concrete action against corruption, turning technology into a tool for accountable, citizen-driven change.



CCC Lalmonirhat Mobilizes Members to Strengthen Anti-Corruption Action

CCC Lalmonirhat brought together YES and ACG members to share experiences, tackle local challenges, and advance integrity and transparency in community institutions. TIB provided guidance to enhance grassroots anti-corruption initiatives, and participants took an anti-corruption oath, reinforcing their commitment to accountable and citizen-driven governance.



YES Group Mobilizes Students to Fight Corruption

YES Group at the Institute of Education & Research, University of Dhaka, energized over 200 students and faculty in an action-packed Anti-Corruption Campaign supported by TIB. Through a cartoon exhibition, signature pledge wall, and interactive anti-corruption games, participants learned to identify corruption, take responsibility, and commit to promoting integrity in their communities.
